

## **MSMPER205 Enter Confined Space** **(1-Day Course)**

Student will have completed off the job training during which the following key theoretical competencies were taught in relation to the Safe Entry and Working in Confined Space.

The aim of this training is to assist in providing a safe system of work where there is the risk of entering Confined Space.

**Note: Pre-requisite unit *MSMPER200 Work in accordance with an issued permit* required**

- Definitions of a confined space
- Roles of personnel involved in working in a confined space
- What defines a person as having entered a confined space
- Duties of a Stand-by person, confined space Permit Issuer & a Permit Holder
- Gas testing requirements, when and by whom.
- Using the Hierarchy of control to identify hazards in confined space
- Effects of these gasses on the body and treatment of persons that have been exposed to them
- Types of asphyxiants effects of oxygen depletion
- NIOSH Exposure limits, STEL, PPM and TWA
- Pre entry requirements, Isolations, Emergency Plans, Ventilation, Communication
- Understand Job Safety Analysis (JSA) or/and Risk Assessment (RA)
- Emergency rescue procedure
