

CPCCLRG4001A Licence to Perform Rigging Advanced Level (4-Day Course)

This unit specifies the outcomes required to perform rigging work at the advanced level, which includes all the outcomes for rigging work at the basic and intermediate levels, and also includes rigging of gin poles and shear legs, flying foxes and cable ways, guyed derricks and structures, and suspended scaffolds and fabricated hung scaffolds for licensing purposes.

Note: Pre-requisite unit *CPCCLRG3002 Licence to Perform Rigging Intermediate Level* required

LEARNING OUTCOME:

- ability to calculate Safe Working Load (SWL) and Working Load Limit (WLL)
- ability to erect and dismantle, level, plumb and stabilise associated plant and structures
- ability to work safely at heights including the correct application of safety equipment
- accurate interpretation of structural charts and structural plans (site information)
- correct application and use of all rigging and associated equipment
- applying methods for making temporary connections of ropes using fibre and synthetic types
- risk assessment and hazard control strategies
- interpersonal and communication skills at a level sufficient to site/workplace requirements. This includes the relevant communication methods and equipment
- verify problems and equipment faults and demonstrate appropriate response

Upon successful completion of this course, student will be awarded a Statement of Attainment and the High Risk Work License* to Perform Rigging Advanced Level by WorkSafe WA.

(* STES will submit student's WorkSafe application and issue the SOA after full payment is received)
